Dear families,

We started the year with **Give Me 5 Week** which gave our children and staff the chance to establish routines and build relationships. Our **Give Me 5 Family Night** was well attended (despite the weather) and was our first chance to gather as a school community in 2023.

3 Way Conversations allowed for families, students and teachers to come together to support the learning of our children and **Before School Reading** on a Wednesday morning has been popular with children and their families. Our Year 3 and 5 children took part in the annual **NAPLAN** Assessment tasks and gave their best efforts.
