As spring blooms around us, we thank you for this term's growth and learning. Bless our students, teachers, and families with restful, joyful spring days.



PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear families,

Here we are at the end of another term that provided numerous opportunities both in and out of the classroom and covered 'learning' in a broad sense. As well as the day to day classroom activities our children experienced, there were also other aspects of school life.

Term 3 started with our **3 Way Conversations** that allowed our families, children and staff to acknowledge and celebrate achievements from Semester One and set goals for the second half of the year. Our **Year 3/4 students** participated in the **'One Tree Per Child' Program** conducted by **Greater Dandenong** and our **Prep and Year 1/2 classes took part in an incursion '***Recycling**Rules'* **that worked in with their studies on sustainability. Our Preps** celebrated the milestone of their first **100 Days of School** and our **'Mathematics through Games' Family Workshop** was well attended and had an impact in this vital area of education. Our **Book Week** and **Book Fair** were highlights of the term and we **acknowledged and thanked the fantastic work our Learning Support Officers (LSO's) do to support our children.**

We continued to share, develop and celebrate our faith not only as a school but with our parish of St Gerard's by attending the parish masses for the **Feast Days of Mary of the Cross (Mary MacKillop) and the Feast of the Assumption.** There were also a number of class masses throughout the term and our **Living Rosary on the Feast of The Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary** saw parishioners and our school come together in prayer.

As a school community we welcomed our **Grandparents and Special Friends** on the **Feast Day of Sts Anne and Joachim** and it was wonderful to see these 2 generations come together and share the special bond they have. Similarly, our **Father's Day/ Father Figures breakfast** saw the significant males in the lives of our children spend time together at our school. Our **Garden Market Stalls conducted by our students** were (as always) well supported.

From a sporting perspective, we had our Year 5/6 Gala Day with us fielding teams in Soccer and Volleystars and 40 children from Years 3 - 6 participated in an AFL 9's day. Our Year 3-6 Gymnastics Program proved again to be successful and our Walk / Ride to School days consistently saw more than half our school start the day with some exercise. The Legion of Mary runs a Junior Legion of Mary praesidium (branch) at St. Gerard's Catholic Church, North Dandenong once a week after school during school term. Meetings last for one hour per week. All possible care will be taken while your child is with us.

Growing a mentally healthy generation

Mindfulness

Mindfulness is a proven technique used to reduce stress and help people cope with tough times.

What's mindfulness?

Mindfulness involves training our attention and attitude.

Being mindful means awareness of your own moment-to-moment internal and external experiences, with gentleness and acceptance and without judgment. It's a state of being that encourages us to slow down, focus on the present, accept things as they are, and act with discernment. When we do this, we're less distracted by thoughts of the future and the past, which can often make us worry and stop us from enjoying the present moment.

What does it mean to be unmindful?

To better understand what it means to be mindful, it helps to understand what it means to be 'unmindful'. When we're inattentive, distracted and disengaged from the present moment, the mind habitually and unconsciously slips into what's called 'default mode' – we're physically doing one thing but the mind is somewhere else. For example, someone might be speaking to us, but we're not listening, or we might be reading a book but not taking in the words on the page.

Much default mental activity involves things such as worry or rumination about the past and future, which is one of the main reasons there's so much default mental activity in states like anxiety and depression.

Mindfulness is very simple

It's a practical way to notice thoughts, physical sensations, sights, sounds, smells, or anything that you might not normally notice. The moment we re-engage attention with the present moment, we switch off default mode. It gets us back on task, helps the body to relax, and helps us to respond to the moment. Despite this simplicity, mindfulness doesn't come easily to us.

You've probably noticed that children and young people are much better at being mindful – it's natural to them. While we might be hurrying them to get to school on time, they'll stop to look at butterflies, flowers or bugs and be immersed in that moment, with no worries about the past or future. As adults, however, we're often thinking about what we need to do next or what we wish we'd done differently.



Mindfulness takes practice

Mindfulness is about learning to make a conscious and discerning choice where our attention lies, rather than allowing it to be dominated by concerns which take us away from experiencing the present moment. It allows us to stay open, curious and flexible about the moment that we're in.
