PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear families,

As we come to the end of Term 3, I would like to acknowledge events from this week and also reflect on what has been another fantastic term.

Yesterday (Thursday) we had our annual **Footy Day** where we encouraged everyone to wear their AFL footy team colours. We had a parade at 9.00am in the PAC followed by our longest kick competition with children, staff and families displaying their kicking skills! It was wonderful to have families come along and be part of this occasion.

Reflecting on Term 3, there were numerous opportunities for learning, participating, celebrating and improvement.

From a Faith perspective, our Year 3-6 children celebrated the Sacrament of Reconciliation, the Parish Legion of Mary joined with our children to pray the Rosary together, we conducted our annual Living Rosary, celebrated the Feast of Mary of the Cross (Mary MacKillop) and the Feast of The Assumption of The Blessed Virgin Mary with the parish community and attended parish 9.15am masses in our year levels.

Learning in Term 3 started with our 3 Way Conversations to celebrate the success of Semester One and set goals for the second half of the year. Our Prep children celebrated their first 100 days of school and we continued our before school reading on Wednesday mornings. Our Mathematics Family Workshop was well attended and provided our families with strategies to support their children's learning. Book Week was once again a celebration of reading along with our Book Fair and a number of our children taking part in the Premier's Reading Challenge. We also had our children participate in the First Aid in Schools Program conducted by St John's Ambulance. Our students, staff and families were involved in the Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools – School Improvement Surveys (MACSSIS) which provides important feedback on what we are doing well and where we can improve. This survey is open until next Monday so please check your emails for the link and PIN to complete the fParent Survey.

With regard to **Sporting endeavours**, our Year 5/6 children took part in their second **Gala Day**. We had a number of **Walk/ Ride to School Days** and we started before school Skipping on Tuesday and Thursday mornings. Children represented our school at the **Dandenong District Athletics event** with 4 children qualifying for the next level of competition which will be held early next term. **Our Year 3 - 6 children** were also involved in a number of **Netball clinics** to enhance their sporting and social skills when working in a team.

We also continued our weekly Art, Library and Garden Clubs at lunchtimes which provided our children with the opportunity to explore their interests in these areas of our broader curriculum.

Our School Community gathered to acknowledge and thank our Grandparents/ Grandfriends. We also had a number of Open Days to show prospective families all that we do here at St Gerard's. Our Father's/ Father Figure's Day Breakfast was well attended by these significant adults in our children's lives and it has been lovely to see more families coming to our Monday Meditation and Friday Assemblies.

What's resilience?



Resilience refers to the ability to manage everyday stressors and challenges.

Resilience enables people to shift back along the mental health continuum towards good mental health. A child or young person's ability to be resilient can depend upon many things and can change depending upon their situation. Importantly, specific situations or events that one child or young person may find challenging, another may not. Learn more about how you can help build resilience in children.

A child or young person who is resilient might:

- be optimistic
- use positive self-talk for encouragement
- have a positive sense of self
- identify and express their feelings and thoughts
- not hide away from strong feelings
- have helpful, age-appropriate strategies to manage their emotions when upset
- rearrange their plans to work around an unexpected situation
- have a sense of agency or responsibility
- keep on trying if something doesn't work out and use their judgment about when to stop
- hold a sense of purpose or hope for the future
- actively ask for help if they need it
- feel a sense of attachment to family, their learning community and to learning.

This week in Library Club, students took part in the final part of the 3-Part Challenge to help the aliens of Xertz become good library citizens, as well as an iSpy Library Activity.



Well done to everyone who completed all three challenges and became fantastic Library Citizen Trainers.






Congratulations on Your New Arrival!
