Give Me 5 News

This week in our SEL lesson we revised the "Being Cooperative in the learning areas" expectations from our Give Me 5 matrix.

The Prep to 6's discussed the importance of being Cooperative in the learning areas by following directions, moving safely, staying on task, sharing with others and helping each other.

The students worked collaboratively to determine if a scenario demonstrated students being cooperative or not. The student's role played different scenarios of how they could be cooperative in the learning areas.

Research shows that children and young people's learning is influenced by a range of social and emotional factors.

Children and young people with social and emotional learning skills have better academic outcomes, as well as improved physical health and a better quality of life. How well individuals do in their learning community is affected by things such as how:

- confident they feel about their abilities
- o effectively they're able to manage their own behaviour
- well they can concentrate and organise themselves
- effectively they can solve problems
- positively they can get on with educators and their peers
- effectively they consider others' needs
- well they can understand and accept responsibilities.

Therefore, SEL and success within the learning community go hand in hand.

From Monday 22nd August to Friday 26th August, St. Gerards will be celebrating Book Week 2022!


The theme for this year's Book Week is 'Dreaming with eyes open...'
