### PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

#### Dear Families,

We find ourselves at the end of the last full week of Term 1. It is a week where we have recognised and celebrated our diversity which is a defining and significant aspect of our school community. We also continued to provide numerous, regular opportunities for our children to learn, develop and enhance their faith.

On Wednesday we had our regular Before School Reading in the Library which continues to be well attended. We also had a number of children join members of the Parish Legion of Mary in the church at lunchtime to pray the Rosary. This is a wonderful way to connect with our parish and participate in this significant aspect of our faith. Our after school AUSKICK program continued with one more session planned for next Wednesday (to make up for the session that was postponed).

On Thursday our Year 4 children celebrated the Sacrament of Reconciliation in our school. As we are coming towards the end of Lent, this sacrament can highlight our failings and the need to change as we prepare to celebrate Easter. Thursday also saw us have our latest Ride/ Walk to School Day which had a large number of our children start the day in a healthy way. I would like to acknowledge and thank Woolworths Dandenong Junction for donating fruit for our rides and walkers.

Today (Friday) we celebrated Harmony Day. This is always a fantastic celebration of all the cultures we have at our school and allows us to learn from each other through the sharing of our backgrounds, traditions and stories. I would like to thank Ms Fernandez for leadership and coordination of this event and for the staff and children for entering into the spirit of the occasion. It was also great to have families come and be part of the day and assist with some of the activities. Appreciating and valuing the cultures at our school is something we do every day, however specific days can really enhance our understanding and awareness of all that we have here at St Gerard's.

As mentioned last week, we are always looking for ways to have families involved in the learning opportunities we provide for our children. If there are any adults that would like to help us either in the classroom, for specific events (such as excursions or cooking) or whole school activities, you are always most welcome. Please note that as part of our Child Safety Policies and Procedures all helpers require a Working With Children Check and to have to Volunteer Induction Session. Looking to next week, families are invited to come and visit our Prayer Spaces which have been set up in and near the PAC. These spaces have been designed by our children and depict the significant events of Holy Week, which are foundation aspects of our faith. I look forward to seeing families visiting throughout the week.

As was mentioned last week, I would like to draw to your attention some important dates for Term 2. We have 2 School Closure Days planned which allows for Professional Development and dispenses Time in Lieu that our staff have accrued. Due to the availability of Professional Development activities, advice from Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS) and public holidays, we will be having school closure days on Wednesday 24 April and Friday 26 April with the ANZAC Day public holiday on Thursday 25 April. Therefore there will be 3 consecutive days when the school is closed. I appreciate that School Closure days can be challenging for families. OSHC will run a full day program if they have sufficient numbers which may be an option.

#### What's resilience?


Resilience refers to the ability to manage everyday stressors and challenges.

Resilience enables people to shift back along the mental health continuum towards good mental health. A child or young person's ability to be resilient can depend upon many things and can change depending upon their situation. Importantly, specific situations or events that one child or young person may find challenging, another may not. Learn more about how you can help build resilience in children.

A child or young person who is resilient might:

- be optimistic
- · use positive self-talk for encouragement
- have a positive sense of self
- · identify and express their feelings and thoughts
- not hide away from strong feelings
- have helpful, age-appropriate strategies to manage their emotions when upset
- · rearrange their plans to work around an unexpected situation
- have a sense of agency or responsibility
- keep on trying if something doesn't work out and use their judgment about when to stop
- · hold a sense of purpose or hope for the future
- · actively ask for help if they need it
- feel a sense of attachment to family, their learning community and to learning.


### Medical Plans And Asthma Plans

Just a reminder to parents to provide the school with updated medical and asthma plans for 2024. If your child has asthma or requires other medications please supply ventolin, spacer and medications on the first day back to the school office.

All medications will be stored in individually labelled bags in the school office.

### Pick-up From After-School

Parents are asked to please be prompt when picking up your child/ren after-school. If a ride is not here when school concludes, the student may be sent to aftercare instead of the office. Please remember school aftercare does have a cost involved and time will begin accruing at the end of the school day. If a student's ride has run into an unexpected delay, please call the main office to let them know.



A reminder to families that arrive before 3.25pm to park in the carpark. Joining the drop off/ pick up line, particularly near pedestrian crossing, creates backlog of cars and families from parking in the car which causes Another aspect of this is to be mindful of our procedures at the end of the school day. There are designated pick up areas for our students and pedestrian pathways. It can be busy at the end of the day, especially when it is cold and raining, however we need families walking home or to their cars to use the pedestrian pathways.
