



## **MESSAGE FROM PRINCIPAL**

Dear Families.

I hope that your week has been great. We are well and truly into the routines of the term and this week has seen our students presented with numerous opportunities.

As I mentioned last week, our Year Six students are in the final stages of their preparation to receive the sacrament of Confirmation. The candidates were involved in a reflection day on Tuesday which saw them celebrate Reconciliation, spend time rehearsing in the church and deepening their understanding of the sacrament. The highlight of the day was the visit of Bishop Peter Elliott to our school. In addition to meeting with our Confirmation students, the Bishop also spent time with staff and joined our Year Three and Four students in praying the Angelus. I would like to thank Mrs Verhoosel, Mrs O'Brien, Mrs Theodore and Mrs Stack for their hard work in supporting our students in this significant stage in their faith journey. 
