MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Families.

One of the unique aspects of working in education is that no two days are ever the same. This has never been more accurate than this term! It has certainly been unique with staff, students and families all having to adapt and adjust in all aspects of our lives. While this has been challenging, I feel it has helped us to focus on what is essential as a school - **the learning of our children**. I would like to once again thank all families, students and staff for their efforts and support throughout Remote Learning and our return to school. **Not only has learning continued but we have kept our school and the wider community safe**.

Semester One reports were sent home yesterday (Thursday) and while they look different due to Remote Learning, they still give information on what has been taught and student achievements. I would like to congratulate all our children for their hard work throughout the first half of the year. We will provide the opportunity for you to discuss the report and your child's learning early in Term Three.

If you have a current Health Care Card you are entitled to a reduction. Our families have chosen a Catholic education for their children and in the current economic climate we all need to support each other.

Thank you to the families that completed the **optional Remote Learning Survey** which was **organised by Catholic Education Melbourne (CEM)** and Dr Simon Breakspear from *Agile Schools*. The survey will assist with further developments in education at both a system and school level.

Our efforts in **supporting our St Vincent de Paul** branch was again outstanding. Giving those in need a *'hand up'* rather than a *'hand out'* helps to retain the dignity of people needing assistance. Supporting others is a key aspect of our faith and we are really living this out. *'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.'* Matthew 25:40.

Up until today (Friday 26 June), I have not received any new advice or direction on school arrangements. Therefore all processes and procedures we currently have in place will continue in Term Three. What is self-management?

Self-management is learning about your own feelings and emotions, understanding how and why they happen, recognising them (and those of others), and developing affective ways of managing them.

Emotions include several components:

- physical responses (for example, heart rate, breathing and hormone levels)
- feelings
- thoughts and judgements associated with feelings
- action signals (for example, a desire to approach, escape or fight).

Learning to self-management

This is a critical way that a child or young person learns to cope with the world. When children and young people learn to self-manage their emotions, they feel more confident, capable and in control. They have stronger relationships, are more able to pay attention, learn new things and can cope better with the normal stresses and disappointments of daily life. Developing skills for self-managing a range of emotions is so important for children and young people's emotional wellbeing.
