

The Passion Prayer Spaces

Students taking an active role in The Passion has long been a tradition at St Gerard's. Due to COVID related restrictions, this year, The Passion will be presented through Prayer Spaces. This will be an opportunity for our children to explore The Stations of the Cross and link these to life questions, spirituality and faith in a safe, creative and interactive way. Taking a Catholic perspective as a starting point, The Passion Prayer Spaces will give our children an opportunity to develop skills of personal reflection and to explore prayer in an open, inclusive and safe environment.

The hall will be transformed for a week with a range of creative activities that encourage personal reflection on issues such as forgiveness, injustice, thankfulness, big questions, identity and stillness that relates to The Way. During week 9 and 10, teachers will bring their students for reflection in The Passion Prayer Space.

The opportunity for families and/or parishioners to be invited to The Passion Prayer Spaces, pending COVID-19 density restrictions will be confirmed at a later date.

Seasons - A Program for Grief and Loss

Seasons is a peer support program for children and young people who are experiencing grief and loss in their lives. This loss may be the result of a death, separation or divorce.

Project Compassion

WELLBEING NEWS CONT'D

DID YOU KNOW? Facts from the Be You website How do decision-making skills develop?



Children and young people's decision-making is strongly influenced by the expectations and values they learn from those around them.

This occurs when they:

- observe others (particularly those close to them)
- hear about and discuss values
- have opportunities to make choices and experience their consequences.

Young children regularly choose how they'll behave, which toys or games they'd like to play with, which books they would like to read, or which television shows they want to watch. As they get older, children make bigger decisions that often involve their family, friends and schoolwork. The kinds of choices children and young people make affect their wellbeing, relationships and success.

Young children have some skills for making decisions, but they don't yet have the experience to understand complex adult situations. As their brain grows, a child is more able to hold things in their mind and remember what they've learned. They also improve the way they manage their thinking and feelings, control impulsive behaviour, think about time and plan ahead, and evaluate long-term versus short-term goals. All these skills help children become better at taking action and keeping things on track.

Term 1, 2021 School Procedures and Processes

ST. GERARD'S

Dear Families,

Welcome to the 2021 school year!!

I hope that this letter finds you and your family safe, well and healthy and that Christmas and the holidays have been great. Our staff are all very excited and looking forward to seeing all our students and families in the coming days (Year's 1 – 6 Thursday 28 January and Prep Friday 29 January).

The state government decisions and actions that occurred at the start of the new year were a timely reminder that we need to continue to be vigilant and follow the health advice to keep our community safe.

The health and safety of our students, staff and families is our first priority at St Gerard's and with this in mind we will have procedures and processes to keep us all safe. While there are some changes, many of these are similar to those of Term 4, 2020. These procedures and processes are based upon the Catholic Education Commission Victoria (CECV) 'School Operations Guide Term 1, 2021'.

Please read the information below carefully.

Parent (adult) access to the school

- Parents are now permitted on-site. We are asking that when adults do enter the school
 grounds that they sanitise their hands and wear a face mask when inside any of our
 school buildings.
- Adults are also asked to keep their on-site visits as short as possible. Any adult who is
 on-site for 15 minutes or more needs to record their details at the School Office for
 contact tracing purposes.
- If parents need to contact a staff member they can also use Seesaw, email or phone the school (9791 7553).
- Adults are asked to maintain physical distancing near our children and staff and ensure that they are wearing a face mask.
- · The Office foyer can have a maximum of 3 people at any given time.

Start of the day

- Both the entry gates will be opened at 8.30am.
- A staff member will be positioned at the front of the school to assist with car flow/pedestrian traffic, to welcome students and families back to school and remind adults that if they do enter the school grounds that they must sanitise their hands and wear a face mask when inside any of our school buildings.
- A staff member will be positioned at the gates to welcome students and families, provide them
 with hand sanitiser and remind adults that if they do enter the school grounds that they must
 sanitise their hands and wear a face mask when inside any of our school buildings.
- Families are asked to not congregate in groups near the front of the school, in the carpark
 or the Office foyer due to physical distancing advice.

End of the day

- Both the entry gates will be opened at 3.25 pm.
- A staff member will be positioned at the gates to remind adults that if they do enter the school grounds that they must sanitise their hands and wear a face mask when inside any of our school buildings.
- A staff member will be positioned at the front of the school to assist with car flow/pedestrian traffic.
- Classes will be brought around to the front of the school by their classroom teacher.
- Prep will wait in the usual pick up place (underneath the St Gerard's Sign).
- Year 1's will wait on the other side of the Office entrance (left hand side as you look at the front of the school).
- Year 2's will wait near the cross that is in front of the new building (near the pedestrian crossing).
- Year 3's will wait on the other side of the Office entrance (left hand side as you look at the front of the school).
- Year 4's will wait near the cross that is in front of the new building (near the pedestrian crossing).
- · Year 5 and 6's will wait in the usual pick up place (underneath the St Gerard's Sign).
- · Families with children across Year levels will wait in one of two areas.
- Families with a Surname from A- H will wait together as a family in the <u>area between the</u> <u>school and the Church</u> (there will be no access to the Carpark between the Church and the Hall at this time).
- Families with a Surname from I-Z will wait together as a family near the steps of the Church.
- Additional staff will be present to supervise these areas to assist with students getting into cars and walking home.
- For those families walking home or walking to cars, <u>please use the Pedestrian Crossing</u> and the path along the side of the Church.
- · For families using the car pick up lane, please be extra mindful of pedestrians.
- Please make sure that people collecting children are familiar with these procedures.



School Pick up Arrangements from Thursday 28 January, 2021

Families are asked to not congregate in groups near the front of the school, in the carpark
or the Office foyer due to physical distancing advice.

Other health and safety measures

- Students will be reminded by teachers and staff to wash their hands regularly throughout the day and regular times for handwashing will be organised by the classroom teacher.
- · Each class will have designated taps for handwashing with soap.
- Students are strongly encouraged to bring their own drink bottle of water, rather than using the drinking taps.
- Each class will have a designated tap or water dispenser for re-filling their drink bottle throughout the day.
- Students will be strongly encouraged to use their own essential items (pencils, pens, glue stick etc.)

- Where items/ resources need to be shared, hand hygiene measures will occur prior to and
 after the use of items and the items/ resources will be sanitised.
- Students will have their own designated seat and work space with as much space as possible between students.
- P.E. equipment that has been shared will be sanitised. P.E. lessons will be conducted outside (weather permitting).

Cleaning throughout the School Day

 <u>Significant additional cleaning</u> will continue to be conducted throughout every school day by our cleaning company. This will include items such as high touch areas (eg: door handles, entry and exit points, handrails, playground equipment, sports equipment), sinks and taps being used for handwashing and water bottle filling, toilets and emptying bins.

Monday Meditation, Friday Assemblies and whole School Masses

 These events will be conducted in the PAC and will involve only school students and staff at this stage.
