Dear families.

I hope that this Newsletter finds you all safe, well and good.

Once again we have returned to Remote Learning due to the Lockdown announced yesterday afternoon. I appreciate and acknowledge that this can be challenging in many ways for families and my thoughts and prayers are with our school community at this time.

While learning modes may be different we continue to provide opportunities for our students to develop. Resources can be collected from the School Office from 8.30am - 5.00pm if you have not already done so. Please **check Seesaw** for assigned work and Google Meetings set by your child's teacher. **As always, I encourage families to contact the school via Seesaw, email or phone if we can help in any way. Please stay connected with us.**

Due to the current circumstances we have had to **postpone** the celebration of the **Sacrament of Confirmation which was due to be celebrated tonight (Friday).** We do not have a new date at this point in time. Please be assured that as soon as we can reschedule this significant celebration we will communicate it to you.

At this stage there has been **no decision with regard to First Communion**, scheduled for 14 and 15 August.

Yesterday (Thursday) saw our **Preps celebrate their 100th Day of School.** There has been a theme throughout the week on 100 which has seen our Preps focus on this number in Maths, write about **'When I am 100 years old'** and bring 100 of something to show the class among other activities. A big thank you to Mrs Bruno and the Prep families for making this such a special day (week)

This Sunday is the **Feast of St Mary of the Cross (Mary MacKillop)**. Being Australia's first saint obviously makes this feast day significant but also her contribution to education endears her to schools. Together with Fr Julian Tenison Woods, she **founded the Sisters of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart** and **established a number of schools and welfare institutions throughout Australasia** with an emphasis on education for the poor,
