

### MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Families.

As we come to the end of another week full of learning opportunities, I am continually inspired by the way our children, families and staff are rising to the challenges of Remote Learning and Stage 4 restrictions.

Our **Give Me 5 focus** for this week was '**Be Cooperative**'. This could be seen as a timely reminder to our families and the wider community. While our families are spending more time together at home, cooperation not only contributes to harmony but positive experiences. For our community, it means following the current rules and directions for the good of all. Something for all of us to keep in mind.

This Saturday is the Feast of Mary of the Cross MacKillop (Mary MacKillop). Being Australia's first Saint obviously makes this feast day significant but also her contribution to education endears her to schools. Together with Father Julian Tenison Woods, she founded the Sisters of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart and established a number of schools and welfare institutions throughout Australasia with an emphasis on education for the poor, particularly in country areas.

### **WELLBEING NEWS**

#### **HOW TO HELP YOUR CHILDREN DURING COVID 19**

Here are Ms Bagley-Jones' tips for discussing COVID-19 with your children:

- Assess what they know already. Find out what they understand so you know where to start
- Don't dismiss or minimise your child's fear validate their concerns. It is reasonable to be concerned because they have probably never experienced anything like this before
- Make your explanation age appropriate, provide facts, and keep it positive. Tell them scientists and doctors are working on treatments. Reassure them that most people only get cold-like symptoms
- Give them some control over what is happening. Teach the importance of handwashing and how to do it properly, remind them of their responsibility to protect others from coughs and sneezing. If they are very young, make a game of having good hygiene
- Make it an opportunity to learn. Talk about how our bodies fight viruses. Understanding the science can alleviate fears.
- Remind children that no-one should be ostracised or bullied because they have been associated with the virus
- Do not make it a one-time conversation. Keep checking in to see if they need reassurance or if they have any new questions

The potential spread of the coronavirus in the community is worrying for many parents.

#### Dear parents, guardians and carers

Re: Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the NCCD guidelines (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational
  outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information.
