PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear families,

It is hard to believe that the first half of the School Year is over!

As we come to the end of the term (and the end of Semester One) it is a good time to reflect on all of the **learning opportunities our children have been provided with over the past 11 weeks**. Learning happens in many ways and forms and in addition to the day-to-day classroom experiences our school is always looking for ways to develop our children in all aspects of life. Below are some of the activities St Gerard's provided throughout Term 2.

Celebrating our faith is a key aspect of our school and it was wonderful to be able to share in the Easter Story in the first week of the term with our *Passion Gallery Walk*. We gave thanks for the life of Pope Francis and welcomed Pope Leo XIV as the head of our Church. We joined St Gerard's parishioners to commemorate the Feast of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus and also joined them at 9.15am as levels to celebrate the Eucharist. Some of our children also joined the Parish Legion of Mary to pray the Rosary together on several occasions.

Fr Shanthaiah celebrated Reconciliation with our Year 3, 4, 5 and 6 children over the course of the term. Our Year 6 children were confirmed by Bishop Tony Ireland and our Year 4 children made their First Communion. As a school we supported St Vincent de Paul with our Winter Appeal which saw us fill our large basket to capacity.

As a school community we had a great **Mother's Day** celebration where we recognised the huge, lifelong impact mothers and those in motherhood roles have on us all. Our **Literacy Family Workshop** was well attended and provided an insight to our families on how Literacy is taught and how they can support their children in this crucial area of learning. **Italian Day**, as always, was molto bene! We also recognised our children that are excelling at out of school activities through our **High Flyers** part of our weekly assemblies and our **SUBWAY Lunch** days were as popular as ever!

From a wider community perspective, some of our **Year 6 Leaders** represented us at the **Dandenong RSL ANZAC Day ceremony** and as a school we recognised and highlighted **National Sorry Day and Refugee Week.** These are all significant aspects for our country and ones that our children need to have an understanding of.

Looking at outdoor and sporting opportunities we had our Year 5/6 students represented our school at the St John's College Paul Wade Cup Soccer tournament. Students from Year 3 - 6 participated in our school Cross Country event with some going on to the Dandenong District, Divisional and Regional levels. Our Year 5/6 children had their first Gala Day for the year with St Gerard's fielding teams in Netball and Basketball. As a whole school we continued with Walk/ Ride to School Days to promote health and wellbeing and Hockey Victoria conducted a number of sessions with our Year 3 - 6 children.

Our Prep, Year 1 and 2 students had an incursion presented by Task Works and our Year 3/4 children went on an excursion to Twist-ED Science which enhanced their R.E / Inquiry topic for the term. Our Year 4 and 5 children were involved in *Taster Days* at St John's Secondary College and Nazareth College to gain an insight into Secondary School. We also had our SRC (Student Representative Council) members provide 'student voice'. Due to this group, a number of Lunchtime Clubs were established this term which have proved to be very well attended. Art Club has been running on Tuesdays, Library Club on Wednesdays and Gardening Club on Thursdays. I would like to thank the SRC for their input, suggestions and feedback. It is wonderful to have our students involved in our school and also feel that they can contribute in a meaningful way.

Self-care

Self-care is a good way to manage stress

You need to practice self-care in a way that works for you.

Having said that, there are some common practices that most people find useful, including maintaining a healthy lifestyle by eating well, getting enough sleep and exercise, and cutting back on alcohol and drugs.

Some other strategies which you might find helpful in managing stress include:

- Monitor your stress- recognise your own signs of stress and identify situations you find difficult, so you can be
 proactive about managing stress during these times.
- Learn how to manage your stress in positive ways- such as through exercise, relaxation, breathing, yoga, positive self-talk.
- Be aware of your thinking habits- challenge negative or unhelpful thoughts.
- Schedule 'time out' for yourself- pursue your hobbies or interests.
- Connect- foster and maintain your personal relationships. A sense of belonging and connection is important for your wellbeing.
- Relax- learn and use breathing techniques, progressive relaxation, visualisations or meditation to consciously relax your mind and body. Practice mindfulness by focusing your awareness on the present moment.
- Be mindful and self-aware- focus on how you are feeling and how you act, and the impact that can have on your colleagues and your students. Be supportive of others without passing judgement.
- Consider making specific times or days of the week for activities which support your wellbeing, so they become routine and are less likely to drop off at times of increased work demands or other competing priorities.
- Reflect- find a mentor through your workplace or professional networks to help you grow professionally. Take time to engage in reflective practices about your work and professional development.

Lunchtime Garden Club Update: Growing Together at St. Gerard's

This week, our Lunchtime Garden Club at St. Gerard's was buzzing with excitement as students planted cauliflower, broccoli, and beetroot in our veggie garden. The children explored the importance of plant spacing to maximize nutrient uptake and observed the root systems to understand how plants absorb water and nutrients from the soil. By ensuring adequate space between plants, we promote healthy growth and reduce competition for resources.

Abel took the initiative to observe the afternoon sun's position, ensuring our plants receive optimal sunlight for photosynthesis and growth. Additionally, we set up plant tripods to support our snow peas as they climb, encouraging vertical growth and efficient use of space.

We can't wait to return in Term 3 to continue our hard work and watch our St. Gerard's veggie garden thrive. Stay tuned for

Exciting News: Our Term 3 Landcare Project Begins!


This week, students and staff were thrilled to learn about our upcoming Landcare project launching in Term 3. Each class will be responsible for the garden area outside their classroom, transforming these spaces into vibrant, nature-friendly environments

Student voice will play a pivotal role in the garden design process. Classes are already researching native birds and animals found in Dandenong North, such as the Eastern Yellow Robin and the Eastern Rosella, to ensure their gardens attract local wildlife. They're also exploring Australian native plants like Grevilleas, Callistemons, and Kangaroo Paws, which provide nectar and shelter for these species.

Some classes have eagerly started planning and even cleared their garden spaces in preparation. Be sure to check out the photos below for a sneak peek of their hard work and enthusiasm.


