PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Families.

Welcome to the 2023 school year!

I hope that you all had a wonderful Christmas and holiday and are ready for an exciting year full of rich learning opportunities. It was great to see so many familiar faces on Monday morning.

A special welcome to our new families who are now part of our school community. In addition to our Preps, we have a number of children who have joined us at every year level.

As well as welcoming new families, we also have some new staff members. **Ms Stephanie Adrien** is our **Year 3/4A** classroom teacher. Stephanie has worked with us previously as a Casual Relief Teacher (CRT). She has a great knowledge of our school, children and staff and will be an asset to our school. Welcome Stephanie!

Mrs Michelle Benson will be working with us delivering some of our specific Intervention Programs. Michelle has also worked with us over the past few years and has knowledge and experience in this specialised area of education. She is excited to be joining our staff and we are excited to have her!

Give Me 5 Week has given our children and staff the chance to establish routines, get to know each other better and experience our *Give Me 5 principles of Be Spirit Filled, Be Respectful, Be Cooperative, Be Positive and Be Your Best.* The children have participated in AFL clinics, a Techxibition conducted by Dandenong Library, a Wildlife Xposure session, and a School Disco. In addition, our Year 5/6 classes were involved in Bike Education and Toolbox sessions. We also had our Give Me 5 Family Night last night (Thursday) and it was fantastic to see so many families in attendance and working together. It has been wonderful to see the engagement of our children and staff throughout the week and I would like to thank Ms Nicole Fernandez for her leadership, organisation and coordination.

Now that we are all getting back into familiar routines, a reminder that our school gates are opened at <u>8.30am</u> each morning. If children arrive or are dropped at school before this time there is a <u>genuine safety concern as they are unsupervised and outside the school grounds</u>. Also when it is raining there is no shelter. Therefore I am asking families to drop their children off after 8.30am or wait with them until the gates are opened.

At the end of the day I am requesting families in cars to reduce the traffic congestion in McNab Court. Families that <u>arrive</u> <u>before 3.25pm are asked to park in the carpark.</u> Joining the drop off/ pick up line creates a backlog of cars which causes issues and does not allow families wishing to park access to the carpark. I thank you in advance for your cooperation.

A reminder to those families who have children with a **Medical Management Plan** that if there are changes to any aspect of the plan you need to **contact the School Office**. It is vital that the information we have here at school is current and accurate.

Lastly, an invitation is extended to all our families to join us at our **Beginning of School Year Mass which will be celebrated next Friday 10 February at 12.00 noon in the church.** As part of this whole school gathering our Year 6 Student Leaders will be blessed and receive their leadership badges and hats. I hope you are able to join us.

This first week has set us up for what promises to be a wonderful year at St Gerard's.


Seasons - A Program for Grief and Loss

How do decision-making skills develop?

Children and young people's decision-making is strongly influenced by the expectations and values they learn from those around them.

This occurs when they:

- observe others (particularly those close to them)
- hear about and discuss values
- have opportunities to make choices and experience their consequences.

Young children regularly choose how they'll behave, which toys or games they'd like to play with, which books they would like to read, or which television shows they want to watch. As they get older, children make bigger decisions that often involve their family, friends and schoolwork. The kinds of choices children and young people make affect their wellbeing, relationships and success.

Young children have some skills for making decisions, but they don't yet have the experience to understand complex adult situations. As their brain grows, a child is more able to hold things in their mind and remember what they've learned. They also improve the way they manage their thinking and feelings, control impulsive behaviour, think about time and plan ahead, and evaluate long-term versus short-term goals. All these skills help children become better at taking action and keeping things on track.
