



PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Families,

Here we are at the end of Term 1 and rather than finishing school just as Holy Week starts we will conclude the school holidays just after Easter Monday. While this is unusual, it does provide us with the chance to celebrate the Resurrection closer to Easter Sunday.

Reflecting back over the term it has been one where we have provided various opportunities to educate and develop our children both in and out of the classroom.

The term started with **Give Me 5 Week** that included our **family activity night**. Our **3 Way Conversations** brought together our families, students and teachers to establish the best way to support the learning of our children. **Before School Reading in the Library on Wednesday mornings** continued to be well attended and our **Year 6 Leadership badges and hats** are being worn proudly and those wearing them are having a positive impact on our school. Our **Year 3 and 5 children participated in the annual NAPLAN assessments** and last Friday we celebrated all the cultures we are so fortunate to have here at St Gerard's through our **Harmony Day activities**.

From a faith perspective, we had a number of children join members of the Parish Legion of Mary in the church to pray the Rosary at certain lunchtimes. Year 3 children celebrated the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the first time and we actively participated in whole school and level masses including our Beginning of School Year and the parish Ash Wednesday mass. Some of our Year 6 Leaders attended a special mass at St Patrick's Cathedral to celebrate the Feast Day of St Patrick and Catholic Education Week.

This week, families and parishioners were invited to come and visit our *Passion Gallery Walk* which was set up in the PAC. These pieces have been created by our children and depict the Stations of The Cross, which are foundation aspects of our faith. It was wonderful to see so many visitors attending over the course of the week. I would like to thank Mrs Theodore for coordinating the creation of these pieces and presenting them in such a prayerful and meaningful format.

Health and fitness wise, we had our **after school AUSKICK** clinics which was again well attended. Our **Whole School Athletics Carnival** was a highlight with plenty of athletic talent and school spirit on display. We had a number of **Ride/ Walk to School Days** which are always well supported and a great way to start a day of learning. **Subway Lunch Days** are always popular and something our children really look forward to.

We also had **3 Open Days** to show what we offer here at St Gerard's and it was wonderful to meet so many prospective families.

This week we also had our **Year 5/6 Camp** from Wednesday 2 - Friday 4 April at CYC *The Island* (Phillip Island). This Camp allowed our children to have experiences outside the 'normal' school offerings and was a great way to develop new skills and build relationships. There were plenty of highlights and stories that will be shared and I would like to **thank Mrs O'Brien**, **Mrs Te**, **Mrs Munro and Mrs Zelic** who gave up their time to ensure that our children had a wonderful experience. Their care and support of our children over the 3 days was wonderful to witness.

We are always looking for ways to have families involved in the learning opportunities we provide for our children. If there are any adults that would like to help us either in the classroom, for specific events (such as excursions or cooking) or whole school activities, you are always most welcome. Please note that as part of our Child Safety Policies and Procedures all helpers require a Working With Children Check and need to have come to a Volunteer Induction Session. I would again like to draw your attention to some **important dates for Term 2.** We have 2 School Closure Days planned which allows for Professional Development and dispenses Time in Lieu that our staff have accrued. Due to the availability of Professional Development activities, advice from Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS) and public holidays, we will be having school closure days on **Monday 28 April and Friday 6 June.**

The first week of Term 2 starts on Tuesday 22 April and with the ANZAC Day public holiday on Thursday 25 April the first week is a 3 day week. We then have the first of our School Closure days the following Monday 28 April. I appreciate that School Closure days can be challenging for families. OSHC will run a full day program if they have sufficient numbers which may be an option. Please contact Marina (OSHC Coordinator) if you would like further information.

I am asking families to **please park in the designated parking bays** when dropping off and picking up their children. I have had a number of requests to send a reminder as we are seeing an increase in people parking in other areas which creates blockages, frustration and safety concerns. The safety of our children and the school community is something we all need to be mindful of and actively participate in. I thank you in advance for your understanding and cooperation.

Lastly, a reminder that Term 2 starts on Tuesday 22 April.

Fourth Week of Lent





Joshua 5:9-12 | Ps 33:2-7. R. v.9 | 2 Corinthians 5:17-21 | Luke 15:1-3. 11-32

One of the most beautiful expressions in the Bible comes from the prophet Ezekiel (Ezk 11:19). 'Thus says the Lord, I will take their hearts of stone and give them hearts of flesh.' It is a call to be tender and compassionate.

You would need a heart of stone not to be affected by the stories we encounter today. Most of us have heard the story of the two sons in today's Gospel over and over. The brilliance of the way Jesus tells stories is that it still gets under our skin. Here are two young men who think they can live on their own terms. One has a sense of entitlement and demands his share of his father's estate which he then squanders. He is finally prepared to eat humble pie and find his way home. The other son has a different sense of entitlement. He believes that his hard work and reliability should provide him with a greater share of his father's love. At different times in our life, we can relate more to one or other of these people. Jesus implies that they are both blind to the way God's love works and that they both need to grow. They have both been dead and now must come to life.

The story we encounter this week is also deeply moving. Irene, aged 25, lives in the Kongolo region in the Democratic Republic of the Congo. Her father was killed during a war and Irene lived with her mother on very meagre resources, often going hungry for extended periods of time. Irene first became pregnant as a teenager and later had to raise her two children on her own, with the support of her mother. As a single mother, it was challenging for Irene to care for her two sons without a stable income.

Irene's life changed after she participated in the Youth Capacity Strengthening program, run by Caritas Australia's partner, Caritas Kongolo. Through the program, she undertook training in sewing and livestock farming, enabling her to generate income to support her family.

Our second reading today reminds us that we are 'ambassadors for Christ.' St Paul says, 'for anyone who is in Christ, there is a new creation.' Let us all be part of building that new creation, setting the world to rights as best we can. Our part is to reach out in compassion and love to heal the wounds of the whole human family. Let us all *Unite Against Poverty* as pilgrims of hope in this Year of Jubilee.




Prayer



What's resilience?

Resilience refers to the ability to manage everyday stressors and challenges.

Resilience enables people to shift back along the mental health continuum towards good mental health. A child or young person's ability to be resilient can depend upon many things and can change depending upon their situation. Importantly, specific situations or events that one child or young person may find challenging, another may not. Learn more about how you can help <u>build resilience in children</u>.

A child or young person who is resilient might:

- be optimistic
- use positive self-talk for encouragement
- have a positive sense of self
- identify and express their feelings and thoughts
- not hide away from strong feelings
- have helpful, age-appropriate strategies to manage their emotions when upset
- rearrange their plans to work around an unexpected situation
- have a sense of agency or responsibility
- keep on trying if something doesn't work out and use their judgment about when to stop
- hold a sense of purpose or hope for the future
- actively ask for help if they need it

Wurundjeri Way Project

We are excited to share some wonderful news! St Gerard's has been awarded a grant from Landcare to help enhance the biodiversity of our school. This project, called Wurrundjeri Way, aims to create a vibrant and sustainable garden area that not only beautifies our school grounds but also supports local wildlife and encourages environmental awareness.

The first class to contribute their thoughts and ideas to this project was 3/4S. The students were eager to discuss how the garden area outside their classrooms should look. They explored a range of topics, including the challenges of dealing with weeds and hard soil. The class worked together to brainstorm creative solutions to these problems, demonstrating their problem-solving skills and teamwork.

One key aspect of their discussion focused on the importance of supporting our native animals. The students proposed installing nesting boxes and planting native plants that would provide food and shelter for local wildlife. 
