## An Invitation to Bring Mary Home: A Week of Family Spiritual Connection

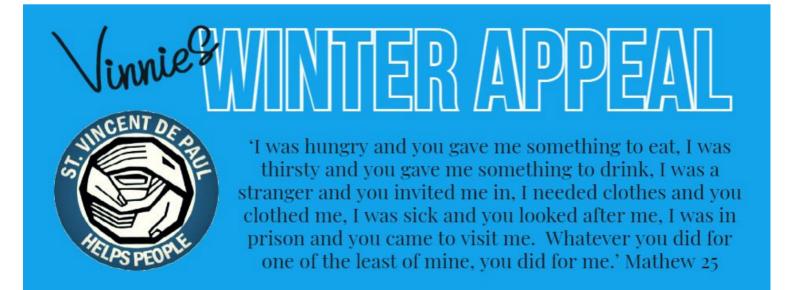

## What do we mean by digital mental health?

Digital mental health refers to services delivered via digital platforms online, mobile or via the phone.

It also encompasses the use of social media and online support communities, which allows people to connect with others who are going through similar experiences or who share their interests.

Digital mental health services can be accessed in a confidential way – allowing children and young people to reach out for support when they may not be able to access support in the learning environment or broader community.

Online support services have been shown to support children and young people's learning, development, social networks, mental health and wellbeing. It can also provide access to opportunities to connect with others, and gain support, through the development of new skill sets to complement and build on their existing social and emotional competencies.

There are a range of online sites, services and supports available specifically for young people. The Be You <u>Wellbeing Tools for Students</u> is your essential guide to the online tools and other resources that will best support children and young people in taking care of their own mental health.

## Walk Safely to School Day – Friday, 16 May 2025

On Friday, 16 May 2025, our school will participate in National Walk Safely to School Day, an annual event encouraging primary school children across Australia to walk or bike to school. This initiative promotes health, road safety, and active transport, aiming to develop exercise routines for children, promote increased intake of nutrient-dense diets, and cause positive environmental action by decreasing carbon emissions from driving to school.

This year marks the **26th anniversary** of National Walk Safely to School Day, championed by the Pedestrian Council of Australia. The event aims to raise awareness of the health, road safety, transport, and environmental benefits that regular walking, or alternative active transport, can provide for the long-term well-being of our children—not just on 16 May, but every day.

### Why Participate?

- Health Benefits: Walking to school promotes physical activity, which is essential for children's health and well-being.
- **Road Safety Awareness:** This day provides an opportunity to teach children about safe pedestrian behavior and the importance of road safety.
- Environmental Impact: By walking or biking to school, we can reduce traffic congestion and lower our carbon footprint.
- Community Engagement: Walking together fosters a sense of community and allows families to spend quality time together.

#### **Important Reminder:**

Children under 10 years old should always hold an adult's hand when crossing the road. This is a key safety guideline to ensure their protection.

We look forward to seeing many families participate in this important event. Let's make this Walk Safely to School Day a memorable and impactful experience for our students.

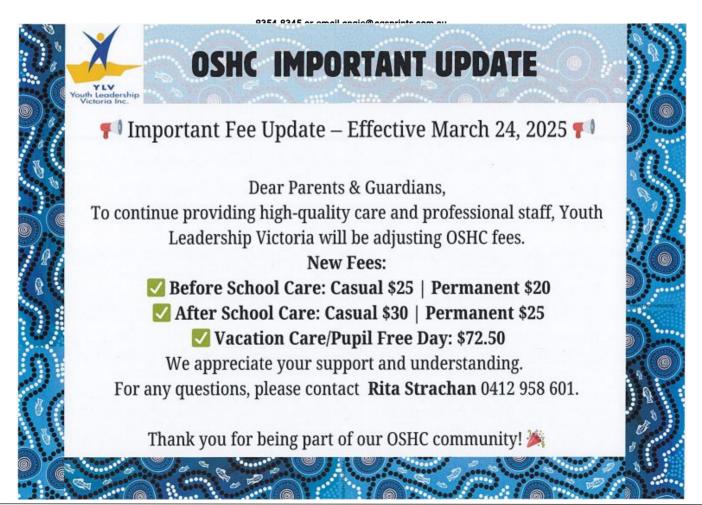
