# PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Families,

This week marks the start of our Church Season of Lent.

On Tuesday there was a distinct smell of Pancakes throughout the school as classes engaged in **Shrove (Pancake) Tuesday.** In addition to pancakes we **also had the first of our Subway Lunch Days** for the year.

As a school we **attended the parish Ash Wednesday mass.** Lent is a time for **Prayer**, **Fasting and Almsgiving** which are key aspects of our faith. It was wonderful to be able to celebrate this important day with the St Gerard's Parish and for our children to experience and celebrate with the wider faith community.

We also had the second of our **Open Days on Wednesday.** These days are an opportunity for prospective families to see all that we offer here at St Gerard's. We have **one more Open Day for Term 1 next Thursday 13 March.** If you know families who will be looking for a school in 2026, we would appreciate you letting them know. Similarly, **if you have a child who will be starting school in 2026 please let us know so that we can ensure a place for them as existing families are our first category of our enrolments.** 

The third of our 5 **AUSKICK sessions** occurred yesterday afternoon with close to 50 children participating. At the end of the session a flyer with information about one of the local AFL clubs North Dandenong MASALA was given out. This flyer is also contained in this newsletter and is on our Community Notice Boards. If your child is interested in playing AFL it might be worth investigating what this club has to offer.

As I mentioned last week, an aspect of our end of day dismissal is to be mindful that there are designated pick up areas for our students and pedestrian pathways. It is busy at the end of the day and we need families walking home or to their cars to use the pedestrian pathways. To walk in front of the cars in the 'pick up' area can be very dangerous. Our aim is to get all our children and families home safely. I thank you in advance for your cooperation.

In other traffic reminders, it has been brought to my attention that **when turning RIGHT out of the Car Park** there have been several cars that have gone through a red light at the crossing. I am asking all families to be mindful of this as it is a busy time of the day with plenty of cars and pedestrians making their way home. We all have a responsibility to look after each other and keep each other safe.

Finally, a reminder that next Monday 10 March is the Labour Day Public Holiday and there is no school.

### **Ash Wednesday**





Joel 2:12-18 | Ps 50:3-6. 12-14. 17. R. v.3 | 2 Corinthians 5:20-6:2 | Matthew 6:1-6. 16-18

There is a great story about G K Chesterton, the famous writer who died in 1936. Among many things, he was the creator of Fr Brown, the detective who uses powers of empathy to understand people better than the police. He was once asked to contribute an essay to a collection on the theme of 'What is Wrong with the World?' His response to the question required only two words. 'I am,' he wrote.

Ash Wednesday, which celebrates the start of Lent, calls us to a more courageous engagement with reality. That is why, when we receive ashes, we often hear the words 'remember you are dust and to dust you will return.' That is our truth. It is easy to look at the state of the world and descend into blame and indignation.

Sure, there are many things that are desperately troubling. Wars, poverty and environmental degradation are part of a long list. But who among us has the courage to own up and respond to the question, 'what's wrong with the world,' by answering 'I am.'

Don't misunderstand. We are mostly good people, doing our best to love and serve each other. But we would sell ourselves short if we left the future of Earth to others who we thought were more to blame. Ash Wednesday asks us to look at the world and our part in it. Every year, we begin our journey to Easter with Jesus's advice to go into our private room, wherever that may be, and encounter the Lord one on one. Christianity, unlike so much else in the world, has little time for self-marketing.

Ash Wednesday is Day One of our Lenten journey. God's invitation to 'come back to me with all your heart' is also an invitation to leave our private room and step into a world in urgent need of our love and honesty. This year, Project Compassion is calling us to *Unite Against Poverty*. St Paul says, 'now is the favourable time.' We can make the most difference when we are most truly ourselves.



#### Prayer

We pray this Lent for a deeper trust in God's plan. May our commitment to prayer, fasting and almsgiving, awaken within us a hunger for justice and compassion. May the Jubilee year remind us of our need for a fresh start. May our work for Project Compassion help us to Unite Against Poverty.

### How does confidence develop?

#### Babies are born curious



They want to touch, see, hear and taste everything within their reach. Toddlers and preschoolers demonstrate their need to understand their world by asking many 'why' questions. From their repeated experiences of seeing their actions affect their world and the people in it, young children begin to see themselves as capable and having control. This helps them to feel good about themselves and builds their self-confidence.

#### When they begin school, children typically start out with high expectations

But when they see how they do things compared to others, their view of their own abilities often changes. They learn that they're good at some things and not so good at others. They also see how other children and educators respond to what they do. These things influence children's confidence in their abilities. They also influence how willing they are to have a go in situations where they feel unsure.

#### Your response

The way adults respond to children as they explore their place in the world is their template for solving many challenging and difficult problems later on. For young children, it helps strengthen their sense of self when significant adults nurture their natural curiosity and demonstrate patience and interest. In primary school years, children who are suddenly less sure of themselves may need extra support and encouragement to build a functional sense of confidence they can take with them into adolescence.


### <u>Medical Plans And Asthma</u> <u>Plans</u>
